Proceeds from this event will be the final contribution of a five-year project to make substantial and appropriate gift to Wayne State University in its centennial year on behalf of the women alumnae.

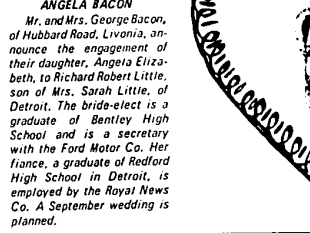
Mrs. Charles Huber, Grosse Pointe, is chairman. Tickets may be purchased from Alumni House, Wayne State University.

Michigan BPW Marks 50th Year

The Michigan Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs held its 50th Anniversary celebration in Detroit, last weekend, with close to 800 attending.

Livonia, Farmington, Garden City, Redford and Plymouth BPW Clubs joined in the celebration and gift presentation to the state federation.

Among the gifts were \$800 for the ship "Hope", \$1,000 for a children's hospital in Upper Michigan, and several large amounts added to the federation's cancer fund which now exceeds \$33,000. A check for \$1,500 was presented to the National Research Foundation in honor of Marion McClench, past state and past national president from Lansing, now 86 years of age. Representatives also were present from Wisconsin, Indiana, Alabama, Ontario, Ohio.

Mrs. Bombeck, whose syndicated column is carried in the Detroit Free Press, is a resident of Centerville, O., a suburb of Dayton, wife of a high school principal there and mother of three youngsters, Betsy, Matt and Andy.

SHE MET her husband when she was a copy girl for the Dayton Herald, and he ran copy for the Dayton Journal.

Later she wrote for the women's department of the Dayton Journal-Herald until her children arrived. Her column first appeared locally in October of 1965.

Her first writing assignment, she has reported, was an interview with Shirley Temple. Or that meeting, she said.

"I thought we would have a lot in common because we were both 16. We didn't."
