To Survey Locally On '67 Employment

Six to 12 selected Farmington households will be surveyed about employment during 1967 as part of the February current population survey conducted by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Census.

In the last three fact-finding assignments of the bureau, Farmington homes have been selected for "what the bureau terms" random sampling.

ACCORDING to Robert A. Yerkey, director of the Detroit Regional Office, the local area is one segment of the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (Oakland, Wayne and Macomb counties) from which the Washington census office selects individual addresses for survey. One thousand addresses are selected in each area each

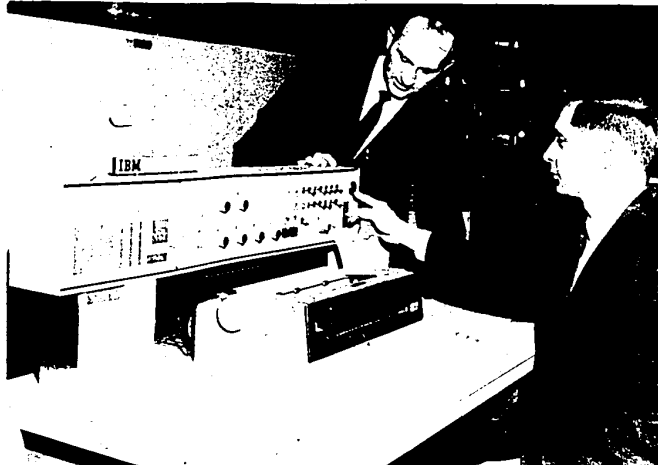
month for sampling. Nationally there are 358 sampling areas. Selection of a specific address is made from 1960 census information.

In the current 1967 employment survey, questions will be aimed at finding out the number of weeks worked during the year, the amount of time lost because of unemployment and other reasons, and the job held the longest time during the year by each person over 14 years of age in sample households.

FROM THIS information, national estimates will be drawn on current employment and unemployment.

The identity of households sampled is confidential and the facts obtained are used for statistical purposes only.

Process Class Planned

Data processing courses, proposed as a future study in Farmington schools, have evoked considerable student interest at both Farmington high schools.

When the courses become a reality, Orchard Ridge campus will place data processing facilities, presently not being used to full capacity, at Farmington students' disposal.

Still in the planning stage, classes for 11th and 12th grade students are to be scheduled in the areas of unit record equipment, data processing applications and data processing supervision.

A preliminary course, Introduction to Data Processing, would be required prior to a student taking these.

The proposed program will move along on two separate tracks—one will serve the business student who wants to learn about unit record equipment, collators, sorters, interpreters and printers per se.
