Farmington's mustipal capital improvement program was given its annual pidating by the City Planning Commission this week, with 11 projects being endorsed for the next fiscal year sarting July 1. They are among 17 which the commission has approved as a six-year program to run through 1973 at a total cost of more than \$4 million, only one-fourth of which would be paid on the commission of the property of the program of the property of the project of the property of the property of the project of the project

CITY MANAGER John D. Din-an calls the 1968-69 phase of the program "the most ambit-iots we ever have undertaken in one year." It includes these specifics:

1. Widening of Farmington Rd. from Eight Mile Rd. to Nine Mile Rd.

2. A water improvement program calling for installation of a 12-inch water main from the Nine Mile pumping station to Gill Rd. and then north to the Grand Fluor program.

3. Improvement of city park facilities.
4. Construction of a 6,000-square-foot steel storage build-ing for the D. P.W.
5. Paving of four streets in the Alta Loma subdivision, Al-ta Loma, Moore, Conroy Ct. and Cass St. of Cass St.

6. Installation of a 12-inch water main on Drake Rd., south
