DEMOCRATIC SEN. Stephen M. Young of Ohio ripped into a former political rival, Republican Rep. Robert Taft Jr., asserting he "has the Taft name and the backing of the Taft family fortune but not much else going for him."

A NON-PROFIT organization, the Theater Development Fund, says it has received a \$200,000 federal grant for its program to help aging Broadway shows which it feels would succeed if kept open long enough.

ADMINISTRATION sources predict President Johnson's forthcoming health message to Congress won't recommend adding the cost of prescription drugs to the medicare program.

GARBAGE and rubbish began to pile last Monday in Memphis, Tenn. when 1,150 sanitation workers walked off their jobs. Public Works Director Charles Blackburn said the strikers are asking the city that the pay of laborers be raised from \$1.80 an hour to \$2.35 and the rate for truck drivers be boosted to \$3.

A NEW TABLOID New York City daily publication, containing only columns and political cartoons, is scheduled to reach the newsstands March 11. Jerry Finkelstein, publisher of the New York Law Journal and the Civil Service Leader, announced the plans for the paper last week.

STOKELY Carmichael drew ceaseless heckling as well as cheers when he brought his Black Power message to a predominantly Negro audience of students at Roosevelt High School in Washington. During his hour-long talk, many of the 600 students left.

ENACTMENT by the American Bar Association of proposed restrictions on news coverage of the court and the police station would contribute to increasing the alarming growth of crime in this country, said David N. Schultz, president of the Associated Press Managing Editors Association. Schultz said that approval of the "Hearst Report" by the ABA would come at a time when more news should be printed about crime instead of less, so that added public support for improved law enforcement might be obtained.
