International Spice

The most international of all spice blends is mixed pickling spice which usually contains from 10 to 16 spices from a dozen different countries. A teaspoon of this blend, tied in a small bag, lends delicious flavor to many slow-cooking stews, soups, sauces.



Here are a few simple repairs for faulty window shade operation:

• If the shade snaps up for no reason, it has a spring that is too tight. Roll the shade to the top, remove roller from brackets, unroll halfway by hand and replace in brackets.

• A shade that falls or wobbles may have a bent stationary pin. Straighten the pin with pliers or replace with a nail of about the same size.

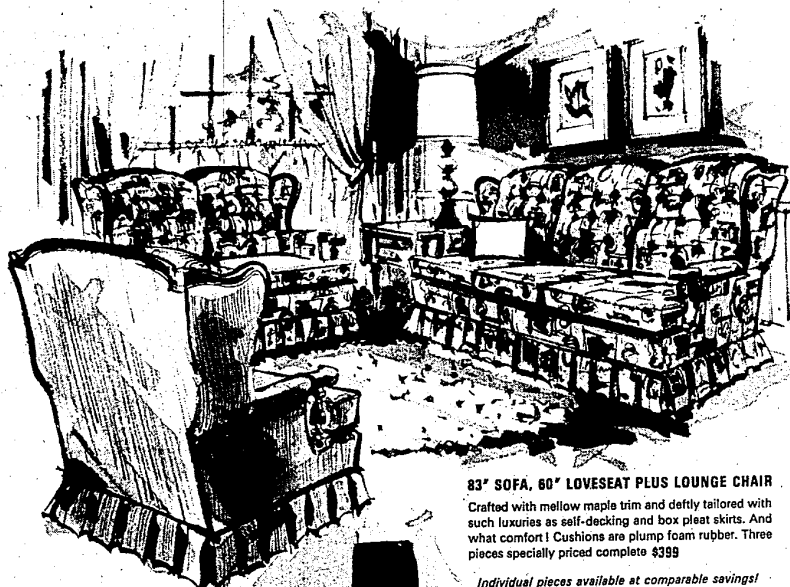
• Loose brackets should be remounted with screws instead of nails.

• If lubrication of pawls seems in order, use graphite instead of oil. Oil becomes gummy and picks up dirt.

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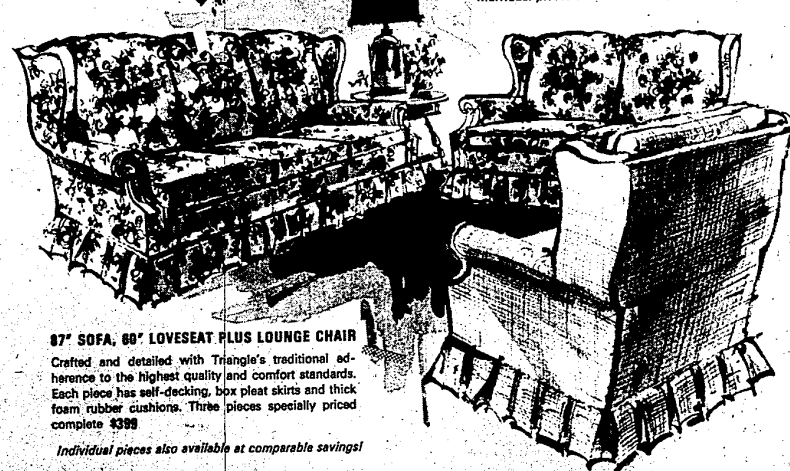
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
