

Glenn Rips Franklin With Fury

A two-man assault by Kerry Webb and Paul Chevartari carried Glenn to 57-45 victory over Franklin in the final regular season battle for both teams.

The setback left Franklin with only one win in 17 starts.

Webb hit for 24 points and Chevartari 20 as each made nine baskets -- all but three of the field goals fashioned by the winners.

Franklin trailed by only two points, 35-34, after three quarters, but then Chevartari hit for nine points and Webb six in the closing six minutes to wrap up the outcome.

Brad Lyons had 13 points and Doug Sutton 12 for Franklin which lagged, 14-8, after the first period, then took a 24-21 halftime lead as Lyons notched seven points and Charles Wiggins five in the second stanza.

Rocks, Bentley Victors In Swim

It was a happy finish to the dual meet swimming season for Plymouth and Bentley Highs.

Meantime, Redford Union ended on a losing note as the teams wrapped up preparations for next weekend's Suburban Six League championships at Trenton.

Plymouth won over Trenton, 58-44, while Bentley squeezed Belleville, 53-51. Allen Park, the favorite for the league title, whipped Redford Union, 56-45.

Chick Porter and Bob Rienas each scored two victories for Plymouth. Porter, whose time of 22.6 seconds is the best in the state, won the 50-yard free in 23.5 and the 100 in 51.5. Rienas capped the individual medley and breast stroke in the respective times of 2:28 and 1:09.

Pat McCord registered a new pool record at Trenton with a clocking of 54.7 seconds in the butterfly. Wally Beglinger won the 400-yard free in 4:28.5, while Greg Nolebaert, Bob Gotschal, McCord and Rick Fugleby teamed to win the medley relay.

BILL PALMER starred for Bentley by triumph in the 90-yard free in 23.5 seconds and the butterfly in 59 seconds. Paul Soehnlein (back stroke), Dave Kee (400 free) and Ted MacLuzek (breast stroke) also fashioned Bentley victories.

So did both relays -- the medley unit of Soehnlein, MacLuzek, Steve Solesberger and Mike Tooley and the free style quartet of Bob Johnson, Ralph Simpson, Tooley and Jim Osborn.

Redford Union's Jerry Halton set two more variety records as he won the 200-yard free and the butterfly.
