## Educators Attend AASS Convention

Farmington Sup't. of schools, Frederick J. Smith and Martin Van Amedy, assistant superintendent, were among 35,000 educators attending the 100th annual meeting of the American Association of School Superintendents in Atlantic City Feb. 17-21.

Presented to participants was a packed program of exhibits, general sessions, group sessions, seminars, workshops and talks by nationally known personalities.

Closed circuit television relating to educational problems was accessible all day. Each afternoon education films produced by NAC and the National Education Association were on view.

THE PAIR from Farmington heard Dr. A.L. Sachar, president of Brandeis University, speak on "The Role of Responsible Dissent."

Ralph McGill, publisher of the Atlanta Constitution and syndicated columnist, spoke at another general session on the topic, "It Was the Best of Times, It Was the Worst of Times."

"The President, the Power, and the Peace," was CBS correspondent Eric Sevareid's subject, and Harold Howe II, U.S. commissioner of education, explained education's federal programs.

Van Amedy's assessment of the experience was, "We returned home thinking Farmington's a pretty great place."
