

'Scared' Public Builds 'Shotgun Courage'

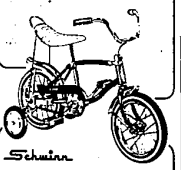
THE SANDS SHIFT AND CHANGE . . .

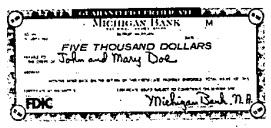
