St. Paul Shows Film Of Christ

St. Paul's Presbyterian Church of Livonia will present a special showing of an outstanding religious movie, "The Gospel According to St. Matthew," at 7:45 p.m. Friday, March 22.

A project called "Focus: Summer Hope" is underway in metropolitan Detroit as the Catholic church's answer to the increasing racial tensions.

The plan is to start the positive approach idea with the Catholic clergy, spread it to members of the parishes throughout greater Detroit and finally work it down to neighborhood meetings.

Out of the project—in the hope of clergy and lay alike, will come some exciting tension through understanding, and possibly some concrete action to replace talk.

SOME 4,000 PERSONS attended a gathering at the University of Detroit last Sunday to get the project moving. A group of priests and laymen, with the sanction of the Detroit archdiocese, formed a working division, already had laid some groundwork with training sessions for 40 clergy members.

The next move will be talks on the next three Sunday mornings in 140 parishes throughout the area, including St. Alexander's of Farmington.

The Rev. Jerome Fraser, of Sacred Heart Seminary, will be speaking for the three services, explaining the program of Focus: Summer Hope.
