Mrs. June L. Sears, a Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service Home Economist, is a new member of the National Advisory Food and Drug Council to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

She was appointed recently by James L. Goddard, M.D., Commissioner of Food and Drugs, with the approval of the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

The Council advises the Commissioner of Food and Drugs concerning the attitudes, interests, and values existing among consumers, industry and the general public, including the attitudes and interests of the scientific community. It alerts the Commission to trends concerning advances in science and technology and the development of new products as well as emergent economic and political trends.

The Council also recommends and suggests to the Commissioner changes in existing programs and areas of emphasis and new programs and areas of emphasis.

A graduate of Wayne State University with a Masters Degree in Family Living Education and a native Detroitier, Mrs. Sears is the first Negro woman to be appointed to this national council whose membership of 17 represents the fields of science, industry, labor, government, law, medicine, education, agriculture, and communications.

Her work with low-income families in Detroit and Wayne County has gained her statewide recognition.

Local Diabetes Association Will Hear Dr. Foa

Dr. Piero P. Foa, director of the division of research for Insulin Hospital, will be the guest speaker at the next meeting of the Livonia Unit, Michigan Diabetes Association at 8 p.m. Monday, March 25 in the Livonia Mall Community Room.

Dr. Foa's topic will be "The Meaning of Glucagon", Glucagon, a hormone produced by the pancreas, acts to release glucose from the liver into the blood.

The public is invited to attend this meeting which is free of charge.

It is one of the factors which may interfere with normal insulin activity and thus produce diabetes, and is currently under investigation by many medical research teams throughout the world. Dr. Foa will discuss what is known about glucagon in terms that can be readily understood by lay persons.

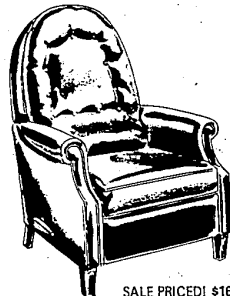

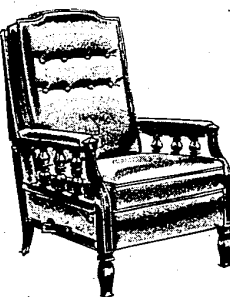
