Souris To Quit Judgeship

Justice Theodore Souris will quit the Michigan Supreme Court July 1 to reduce its size from eight to seven under provisions of the 1963 state constitution.

His decision to return to private practice at 42 caught the legal and political spheres in Lansing by surprise.

Souris was first appointed to the Supreme Court by former Gov. G. Mennen Williams on Jan. 5, 1965, less than a year after he had been named by Williams to the Wayne County Circuit Court.

"First, I always have intended to return to the private practice of law at some time in my career," Souris said. "The calendar dictates that this is the time for me to do so."

"The legal profession offers many opportunities to participate in the challenging public affairs of our times."

"My resignation now...will not only permit me to satisfy a deeply felt professional desire, but at the same time, it will permit me to explore such other opportunities for public service as may arise."

HE SAID he would be 51 if he were elected to another term and served until it ended in 1976.

The move, he said, will implement "the intent of the people of Michigan" to cut the size of the court from eight to seven under the 1963 constitution and end the 4-4 decisions that have confused legal issues in the past.

"Although I would not leave the court for this reason alone, it adds weight to the decision I have made," Souris said.

Tongue in cheek, Souris said he was "sparing everyone the expense" of a campaign for his seat on the court, Wayne County Circuit Judge Edward S. Piggins already has announced his candidacy.

SOURIS SAID he will return the \$18,000 in campaign money raised for him last fall by a fund-raising dinner. He said the return of the money "is a matter of honor."

If donors do not collect the refund, Souris said, the money will be given to the Neighborhood Service Organization and the Northeastern Wayne County Child Guidance Clinic.

"I am deeply grateful to the people of this state who have permitted me to serve during the last eight years as a member of their highest court," Souris said.

"I believe my decision to resign from the Supreme Court is in my family's best interest and in the best interest of the public."

"It is my hope that my friends will understand my decision to leave now before the river of time carries me further."

"In any event, the decision was mine to make, and I have made it."

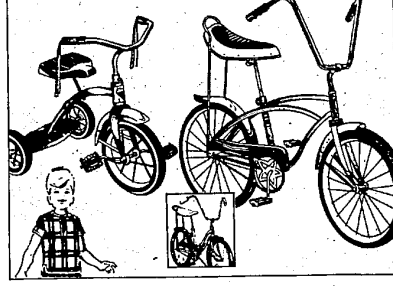
