Congressman Polls Public

FORD POINTED out that the entire Vietnam-Southeast Asia problem is too complex to be answered satisfactorily with multiple-choice questions or simple yes-or-no check marks.

The other "open-end" question provides three lines to list, "the most vital problems facing our nation today."

Ford said that many people complain that the Federal Government is not responsive to the viewpoints of the people.

"Here is an opportunity for my constituents to express their views, and they have heard at the very highest level of the Federal Government," Ford said. "I urge every person to fill out and return his questionnaire, and to encourage his friends, relatives and neighbors to do the same."

RESULTS WILL be tabulated by volunteer workers, and announced as quickly as possible. The tabulations will be placed in the Congressional Record and forwarded to President Johnson.

Ford declared that any person who does not receive a questionnaire should write him at his Washington office, 1006 House Office Building, and request a copy.

"In past years, we have had responses of between 10,000 and 12,000," Ford said. "I am hopeful that there will be an even larger response this year."

In addition to eight questions calling for a simple yes-or-no answer, Ford's questionnaire includes two questions which call for written answers.

One asks, "Do you approve of the present United States policy in Vietnam and Southeast Asia?" and then continues, "If not, what course of action do you suggest?"
