Road Aid Program Outlined

Farmington Democrats are coming up with four possible sources of funds to finance much needed road repairs in the Farmington area.

The four proposals, none of which requires any additional taxes, were advanced at the monthly meeting of the Farmington Democratic Club. Club Chairman Gerald Freedman listed the four proposals as follows:

- 1. Passage of proposed state legislation, the John Bennett bill, which would give townships 4% of all highway funds to be used for local street repairs.
- 2. Adoption of a housing code which would help the township qualify for urban renewal funds, part of which could go for roads.
- 3. earmarking for road repairs some of the extra funds which the county and township will receive as a result of the higher taxes flowing from the recent increases in property tax assessments.
- 4. Earmarking for road repairs some of the new funds

coming to local and county government as their share of the state income tax.

"Each of the four proposals would give us money to start the long-neglected job of repairing the terribly-rutted roads found in parts of the township," Vagnozzi told the group.

Adoption of the four proposals was coupled with a decision by the Democrats to support the goals of the Farmington Volunteer Road Committee.

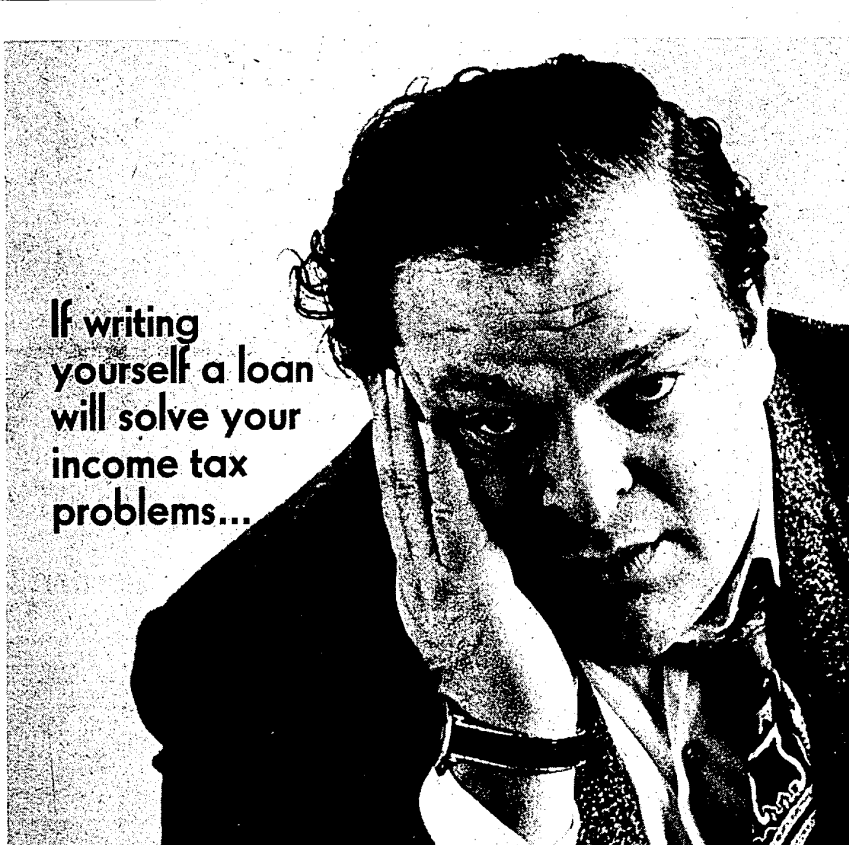
