Load Limits In Effect

Enforcement of the spring-time reduction for wheel and axle loads of vehicles using the highways under the jurisdiction of the Oakland County Road Commission began at 6 a.m. Wednesday, March 13.

Reduced normal weight limitations for all-country roads excluding the all-weather routes are shown on the 1968 Michigan Operator's Map recently published and distributed by the commission.
