Professor Named Editor Of 'Christianity Today'

Dr. Harold Lindsell, 54, professor of Bible at Wheaton College in Illinois, has been named editor of "Christianity Today," an independent, interdenominational Protestant journal publisher.

Lindsell, who will serve for three years as associate editor of the magazine and is a long-time colleague of the retiring editor, Dr. Carl F.H. Henry, who has led the bi-weekly journal since it was founded in 1956.

The Board of Directors asked Dr. Henry to continue as editor-at-large. He plans to use a six-month sabbatical leave for study at Cambridge, England. The board has also provided a 18-month study grant for further research in order to acting in his new capacity with Christianity Today.

Dr. Henry has led the evangelical magazine to international prominence and a circulation of 160,000—largest of America's religious thought journals. This year the Read-

er's Guide to Periodical Literature began indexing the magazine.

Dr. Lindsell was raised in the Bronx, New York. After high school he became an office boy in an insurance company, and had worked up to a job as underwriter by the time he left four years later. He attended Wheaton and graduated summa cum laude in three years. He then earned an M.A. from the University of California at Berkeley and a Ph.D. from New York University, both in history. During a two-year teaching stint at Columbia Bible College in South Carolina, he met and married a student, the former Marion Bolinder. They have three daughters and one son.

Dr. Henry and Dr. Lindsell were two of the four founding faculty members of Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena, Calif. During his 17 years at Fuller, Lindsell served as Dean of the Faculty, Vice President, and Professor of Missions.
