Romney, Hart, Griffin Back Overseas Relief

Governor George Romney and U.S. Senators Robert P. Griffin and Philip A. Hart have given warm personal endorsement to the spring appeals of America's great religious faiths for support of their overseas relief programs.

The current appeals are the Catholic "Bishops' Overseas Aid Fund" appeal and Protestant "One Great Hour of Sharing," both of which were observed in churches in Michigan and elsewhere on Sunday, March 24, and the United Jewish Appeal, a continuing effort with special emphasis at this period of the year.

Through these independent but common purpose efforts, it is possible to provide relief and rehabilitation for millions of the world's homeless, hungry and destitute. Among those aided are victims of man-made and natural disasters, war, flood, famine, earthquake and hurricane; refugees fleeing oppression and political upheaval, and those chronically undernourished and underprivileged.

Jewish Appeal, made public simultaneously in New York today, Governor Romney said: "It is my privilege again to congratulate Church World Service, Catholic Relief Services and the United Jewish Appeal for their efforts to help the less fortunate around the world."

"I am especially pleased that the emphasis of these efforts will be on self-help projects—helping others to help themselves. There is an old proverb that says 'Give a man bread and you have fed him for one day, but teach him how to grow wheat and you have fed him for a lifetime.'"

"It does not believe we can fulfill our obligations to our fellow men by giving them bread for only one day. We must share with them whatever they need most, and to the needy of the world self-sufficiency is the greatest need."

SENATOR HART said: "Food, clothing and medicine arrive at the docks of our less fortunate neighbors around the world in amounts almost impossible to count. The materials are distributed to the starving, the sick, the talented and the prodigious and suddenly there are

faint smiles of hope and the knowledge that someone cares. "This is the type of response that has been generated in the past by the united effort of Church World Service, Catholic Relief Services and the United Jewish Appeal. The Americans who support this program are supporting a constructive effort to serve their fellow men."

"It is a privilege to indicate strong personal support for the overseas aid drive. For many years, the member churches have provided vital assistance to millions of homeless and destitute people abroad."

"By participating in this constructive endeavor, Americans of all faiths can play a direct and meaningful role in helping the people of the less-developed nations of the world."

The three faiths, through their programs of assistance supported by the current appeals, distribute food, clothing, blankets, medicines and self-help materials to millions in need; give aid to orphanages; assist hospitals, tuberculosis clinics and other health efforts, and carry on resettlement and rehabilitation projects for refugees.
