

ILTF Stamps OK On Open Net Tournaments

Open tennis tournaments—pitting the professionals against the amateurs—have won the approval of the International Lawn Tennis Federation.

Thus, for the first time, tennis will offer competition such as golf long has seen in its various meets like the U.S. and Western Opens and most of the other weekly meets on the tour.

Some questions still remain to be answered:

- 1—Will the pros be able to contest for the Davis Cup, tennis' No. 1 meet?
- 2—How many open meets will be scheduled (reportedly, there'll be at least two in the U.S. this year)?

LT. ARTHUR ASHE of the U.S. Army beat former world champ Roy Thomas of Australia, 6-4, 6-4, 7-5, in the final of the Madison Square Garden tourney in New York. The women's title went to Nancy Richey of San Angelo, Tex., who beat Judy Regart, 7-5, 7-5.

INDIANA WON the NCAA swimming championship as Charlie Hickok won three events. Meanwhile, Mike Burton of UCLA became the first swimmer to break the 16-minute barrier for the 1,650 yard free style with a time of 15:59.4. Hickok's efforts included a record of 1:55.3 in the 200-yard backstroke.

CALUMET FARMS Forward Pass took a big step toward the role of favorite in this year's Kentucky Derby by winning the \$14,000 Florida Derby. Iron Huler came in second, with nobody else close.

Wise Exchange, the nearly favorite in the Florida race, had been sidelined with foot injury.

RED ALLIGATOR, a 100-shot, won the Grand National in Britain by seven lengths. The horse is owned by a farmer and butcher.

R. Thomas staged a stretch drive to win the Westchester at Aqueduct race track with Grace Horn second in the field of seven.

ANN ARBOR—University of Michigan's baseball team has returned from a spring training trip to Arizona in which the Wolverines won only one of their 10 games.

Catch Mobeey Benedict, however, wasn't too discouraged. The Wolverines had to play Arizona State and Arizona ranked

No. 1 and No. 7 in the country. Arizona State is the defending NCAA champ.

Goodfellow ranks among the all-time Detroit Red Wing greats. He played for 14 seasons, scored 134 goals and picked up 190 assists.

Kobos coached baseball at Michigan State for 39 years. His teams won 557 and lost 464. He was one of the organizers and for years a leading figure in the American Association of College Baseball Coaches.

The doctor of Michigan's Sports Hall of Fame will spring open on May 21 to Harry G. Kipke and Eddie Goodfellow and the late John H. Kobos.

Kipke was a nine-letter winner at the University of Michigan and later coached the Wolverine gridder for nine seasons. He turned out four Big Ten champs and one national king.
