

Churches Honor Dr. King

Churches throughout the area found a variety of ways to honor the martyred Dr. Martin Luther King.

All took time in the midst of Palm Sunday rejoicing to pay silent and spoken tribute to the man who led the non-violent way to racial equality.

Many special collections were taken to carry on the work Dr. King led.

SPECIAL TRIBUTE services also were the order of the weekend of mourning and the days that followed.

In Livonia, a community

memorial service was held Sunday in St. Michael's Catholic Church, and between 300 and 400 faithful filled the church.

Three clergymen, representing Catholic, Presbyterian and Lutheran faiths gave reflections, and several others took part in the service.

The Rev. Thomas Estay, of St. Paul's Presbyterian, told the gathering the white community must bear a large share of the guilt, and added that the "whitehead in society must be brought to an end."

O God, You who are neither red, yellow, black nor white, but who has created us in a marvelous variety of colors and marked us with your image, we ask you to hear us.

THE REV. RONALD Staronko, pastor of Faith Lutheran, said the largely could well bring great pessimism, but added:

"It's easy to lose ideals as one grows older, but through faith in God and the power of Jesus Christ we can work together as Christians."

The other reflection was given by the Rev. Joseph Fennell, of St. Edith's Catholic Church.

ALL RESIDENTS of the community were invited to take part in a "Rally of Hope" to be sponsored by the Interfaith Action Council in the University of Detroit stadium from 6 to 7:30 p.m. Sunday, April 14.

The council said the rally was called to demonstrate "the increasing witness of the people of God that actions do indeed speak more eloquently than mere words."

Lutherans Plan Urban Project

A grass program to help oppressed minority groups and poverty victims of America's urban centers this summer has been announced by The American Lutheran Church.

Member congregations of the ALC, and groups outside the church will be invited to propose "programs of action which the church can constructively carry out to meet pressing needs."

Acting at a special meeting in Minneapolis, the 46-member policy making body for the ALC recently approved unanimously a resolution acknowledging the church's guilt and insensitivity in the past in areas of social concern. The resolution expressed a willingness to respond to suggestions for constructive actions that might be taken immediately to alleviate hardship during the next several months.

The Universalist-Unitarian Church of Farmington, on Halstead Road north of Grand River, will conduct a community memorial service for Dr. Martin Luther King from 2 to 3 p.m., Friday, April 12.

TO MAKE that message more direct, the church decided Sunday to place an advertisement in the Negro publication, the "Michigan Chronicle."

EDDY said a special collection

was taken to cover the cost of the ad and make a contribution to the U-U Church's Freedom Fund.

The minister also said that at the Friday service the church would distribute signs reading "This House is Not Armed."

"These signs were originally designed for use in integrated neighborhoods in the inner cities," he said, "but they can well be used as a symbol here."
