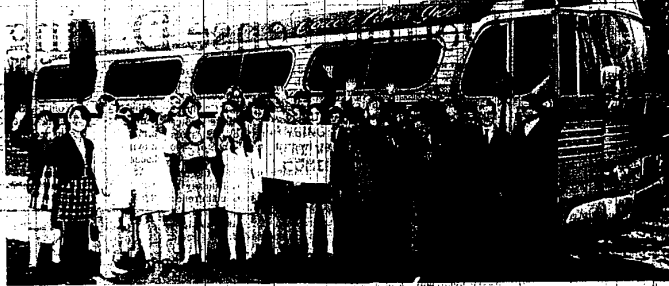


ORDER OF PROBATION

SOUTHFIELD—City Administrator Donald V. Smith has resigned his position to return to private business. City Manager for seven years, Smith had recently had the backing of only three members of the Southfield City Council in the post.

Police Nab Hi-Jacker
 A police chase which at times reached 100 miles per hour resulted in the capture Saturday afternoon, April 6, by Farmington Township officers of a 25-year-old Detroit man in Southfield on a charge of armed robbery.
 The man was identified as James Jones, of 1445 Cortland, Detroit, who hijacked a car from a shopping center at 12 Mile and Telegraph Rds. and less than 20 minutes later was arrested when his stolen vehicle was rammed by a police car at 13 Mile and Middle Belt Rds.

State Has Job Openings
