The committee would investigate "corporate ownership of bank stock, for mation of bank holding companies, the concept of statewide branch banking, use of uniform limited partnerships in the banking and financial institutions businesses, and extension of credit and free flow of money, various methods of 11n anc in glor refinancing loans, and day-to-day purchases of the consumer."

The committee would com-prise five senators and five representatives. Its findings and recommendations would be made to the 1959 Legislature.
