Site Donated To Northville Schools

Oakland County news events during the past week which are of interest to Farmington residents include:

NOVI-A developer has offered a 10-acre school site to the Northville School District in conjunction with a subdivision development on the north side of Nine Mile Rd., between Taft and Center Sts. If the proposal goes through it will mark the second time in less than a year that the Northville schools has received a free school site.

The developer is the West Ridge corporation. The Farmington-based Thompson Brown Co. donated a 12-acre site to the schools in the development of property on the south side of Six Mile Rd. near Braden Rd.

WIXOM-Plans for the annexation of 24 acres of town-ship to the City of Wixom are progressing even though investors have yet to approve the new petition. The proposal is being advanced by Carl Sams, developer of the land, which is located north of I-96, south of Pontiac Trail and adjoining the Wixom city limits.

SOUTHFIELD-Members of the Southfield Police Officers Association have joined with four other Oakland County associations—Beverly Hills, La Thrup, Ferndale and Hazel Park. A local news report asserted that the move was "in an apparent effort to upgrade professionalism and improve the economic level of members."

The police and fire departments members are currently negotiating new contracts with the city.
