Twister: CD Chief Tells How To Save Lives

Civil Defense Director Ken-eth Kampman today reiterated irections for taking cover dur-ng tornado activity during the urbulent weather season. He said the major points were

strongly the need for calm, intelligent behavior during these

tornado's path. Tornadoes usually move ahead at about 25
to 40 miles per hour.

If there is not time to escape, lie flat in the nearest depres-sion such as a ditch or ravine.

If in a City or Town: Seek inside shelter, prefer-Seek inside shelter, prefer-ably in a strongly reinforced building. STAY AWAY FROM WINDOWS!

On receiving a tornadowarning, a lookout should be posted to keep safety officials advised of the tornado's approach. Advance preparation should be made for shutting off electrical circuits and fuel lines if the

tornado approaches the plant.
Workers should be moved to
sections of the plant offering
the greatest protection.

killed by running out into streets

of a tornado. Even though a
warning is Issued, chances of

WHAT IS A TORNADO WATCH? The United States Weather Bureau Issues a tornado watch for areas where tornados may occur during the next several hours. The size of an average watch area is approximately 100 miles wide and 300 miles long. The object of a watch is to alert the public in the area covered by the watch to the possibility of tornadoes, and to advise them to be ready to take precautionary action in case formado warnings are issued. However, people should go about doing their work as usual. Once a tornado has actually formed and its existence becomes known to the Weather Bu-


