THE UNION involved included some 30,000 members, and construction projects amounting to millions of dollars throughout the metropolitation. The big harrier to agreement is the span between the minon demands of wage-fringe benefits, ranging up to 76 per cent, and the offer by employers of 5ix per cent increases each year for two years.

Most of the negotiations have been with the key Carpenters Union, considered the one that will set the pattern for the others.

MEANWHILE, the strike of Metropolitan Detroit newspapers moved into the 170th day with no apparent moves in any direction.

The original demands of the union asked for \$24 per day starting immediately. Michigan Bell officials tabbed the offer the largest wage and fringe benefit package ever negotiated by Bell and the CWA, increasing the company's non-management wage bill over three years by 19 per cent and adding \$12,3 million annually to costs.




