It was back in 1949 that Elizabeth Rees, a promising young student of chemistry at the University of Detroit, decided to leave school to get married.

Her adviser, Father George Kmiecik, didn't think much of the idea. He called her into his office to offer advice. That didn't work, so he called in her intended, chemistry student Paul Elsey.

"Of course he didn't change our minds," Elizabeth Elsey said. "But he did get through to me with one thing he said—that married women can go to college later."

now, Mrs. Paul Elsey of Redford Township would like him to know her news. It's 18 years and ten children later, but she has a degree from the University of Detroit.

THE FOUR OLDER Elsey children were on hand to watch with pride as their mother received her diploma at the commencement Saturday, May 4, and the whole family was featured in a television interview in honor of the occasion.

Paul, now 17; Terry, 14; Angela, 13 and Rebecca, 11, had made the scene when, in 1957, their mother decided to be a student again.

Her husband was back at U. of D. working on his master's degree, and for the first time credit courses were being offered on television Channel 56.

"I thought that was wonderful," Elizabeth said. "You sat home in your dirty slacks and went to school."

"I considered math," she said, "but found that the new

math had brought so many changes that I'd have to start over. Then I thought a bit

of psychology. But I wasn't very far into that field before I was convinced I just couldn't buy what the textbooks said."

History finally was the choice, and it was mainly a matter of convenience.

"The history classes were offered at times I could go to school," she explained. "And of course when I got into it, I found it completely absorbing. My husband said I was living history—didn't have to study."

THAT WASN'T quite true, but Elizabeth Elsey never found studying an ordeal. There was no sense of pressure in her low-gear method of getting an education.

New babies arrived with great regularity, but they didn't interfere—at least, not much—with their mother's course or two a semester plan. The family now includes David, nine; Ruth, seven; Barbara, six; Bill, five; Steven, three, and Matthew, 10 months.

"The children always know that two nights a week I left right after supper," she said. "They pitched in and helped, and things always went quite smoothly."

THE CLOSEST THING to a crisis she remembers was the night when "Paul had an exam and I had an exam and someone had the mumps so no sitters wanted to come." That problem was solved when Elizabeth's mother did emergency baby-sitting chores.

Pursuit of a degree was an off-and-on thing for Mrs. Elsey. The family outgrew its first Redford Township home, so she took a year off to design a new one and keep an eye on its construction.

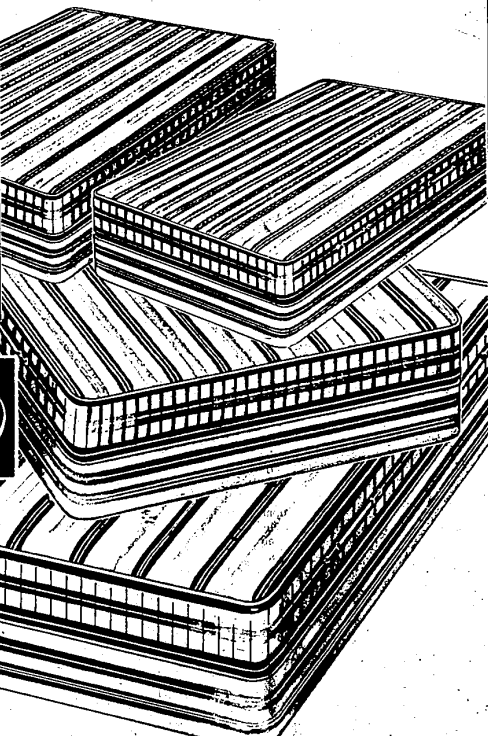
