

# UM Hosts 30 Negro Collegians

Southern Negro colleges will send 20 undergraduate students and 10 faculty members to The University of Michigan for an eight-week multipurpose program this summer.

The students will be developing their potential for graduate studies. The faculty members will be strengthening their teaching and research abilities and the University will be gaining experience for future intensive Summer Opportunities Programs as well as ideas for improving elements of regular academic year programs.

ALL 30 of those coming to U-M this summer have been identified through a consortium of Columbia, Harvard, and Yale universities. Established in 1966, the consortium has been cooperating with 78 predominantly Negro institutions in the South to offer programs similar to the one planned for this summer by U-M.

Dr. Ralph B. Lewis, assistant dean of the U-M Rackham School of Graduate Studies, believes that students who successfully complete the courses in the Intensive Summer Opportunities Program "will improve their chances of being admitted for graduate study in some university and possibility of being awarded fellowship support for graduate study."

Each student will take two graduate credit courses, one in his field of specialization, another in a related area or possibly a seminar requiring a term paper.

"UNDER CONDITIONS of a graduate school," says Dr. Lewis, "the students will be able to assess their own aptitude and commitment to advanced course work, and we will be judging each student's performance by the standards used to evaluate upperclassmen."

"Each student will receive guidance in graduate school placement. We plan to keep in close touch with the students and their home colleges to help them make application for graduate schools."

As for the "faculty associates" who will come to the University for the period June 22 through Aug. 18, Dr. Lewis said the national interest is served in strengthening the facilities of predominantly Negro colleges and universities.

Among the direct benefits anticipated by the University, according to Dr. Lewis, are ideas for improving elements of the academic year programs for Opportunity Award scholars in the graduate school.

Next fall the first students from the U-M Opportunity Award Program will be entering graduate studies. The Opportunity Award Program, started in 1964, is designed to recruit and provide special financial and counseling assistance to qualified Michigan students handicapped by cultural and economic deprivations.

More than 400 U-M Opportunity Award undergraduates will be enrolled next fall term.

## Jockey Holmes Flying

Jockey Don Holmes and the Hazel Park Race Track are in the news again. They are both off to a flying start this spring.

After the first two weeks of the current 14-week meeting at Hazel Park, Holmes is so far out in front in the jockey standings he's almost out of the night. And the track itself may be headed for a new all-time summit of popularity.

HOLMES, 34-year-old Oak Park saddle maker, blazed 27 victories in the first 12 days of the present meeting. If he can keep going at that clip for the remainder of the meeting, which ends July 27, he will double the present record of 97 wins scored by Bob Gallimore last year.

This is a comeback for Holmes, and it couldn't happen to a nicer guy. He finished superior form in 1966 when he brought in 61 winners and finished second to Larry Snyder in the riding standings.

LAST YEAR, HOWEVER, he skidded to 31 triumphs. He has almost matched that mark in two weeks this season.

Dave Whited, who won 119 races at the Detroit Race Course in 1967, is second in the Hazel Park standings with 14 decisions. Larry Kunitake and Jerry Santage have seven each, followed by Grady Overton and Ronnie Campbell with six apiece.

## Driver Taylor Seeks 200 Wins

Ted Taylor, the popular Ohio reinsman, is back at Wolverine Raceway after performing most of the winter at Florida's Pompano Park.

The 42-year-old Taylor, one of America's most successful driver-trainers, is still pursuing a life-long ambition.

"On these years I'd like to check in with 200 victories," he tells you with a smile.

TAYLOR GOT started on the right track a recent Saturday night when he won both features. He won the \$4,500 featured trot with Sonny Fortune in Sonny's first start of 1968 and came right back with Sandra's Comet in the \$5,000 open pace.

Taylor thought he was on his way to his 200-victory season in 1967 but got caught in a November 10, 1967, accident and wound up with 191 victories, a mark which left him eighth in total dashes in the nation. Taylor spends almost every night at Wolverine. He's training and driving 25 head, about his normal complement of horses.

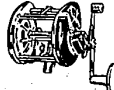
