THE SITE IS Fort Michill-mackinac (that's "Mish-il-uhac-uh-naw"), at Mackinaw City at the top of Michigan's lower peninsula.

Under the direction of the Mackinse Island State Park Commission, archaelogists from Michigan State University are rebuilding the fort as it was 200 years ago when it was a key western outpost for the hucrative fur trade. Restoration began in 1959, Painstaking occavation has uncovered more than 300,000 artifacts that help left the story of the fort and its inhabitants. Coupled with the Fort Michimackinac findings and research in Canadian and English away pieced together precisely the plans of the fort, its buildings and the village outside its gales.
