## Oglesby Returns Stateside

Lance Cpl. Richard L. Oglesby, former captain of the North Farmington High School tennis team, has been returned to the U.S. Naval hospital in Philadelphia after being severely wounded in South Vietnam.

Assigned to the First Marine Division in Vietnam since last July, Oglesby was wounded April 10 near Da Nang while on a tactical patrol.

According to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edwin R. Oglesby of 2840 Herndonwood, their son was evacuated by air to the United States after being hospitalized first in Da Nang and then Japan.

He captained the North Farmington netters in 1965, and following graduation attended Oakland Community College prior to his service in the Marine Corps.
