Many Groups Meet Community Forum Reactions Vary

By three and four, by 16's and 17's, suburban residents who want to make understanding more than just a word are participating in the Community Forum for metropolitan Detroit.

Meeting in churches and homes throughout the Observer area, several dozen small groups are seeing the television series titled "Racism, Rebellion and Renewal" and following it up with thoughts of their own on the weekly topic. The Community Forum is sponsoring the series.

Reaction has been mixed—both to the program and to the possible good it can accomplish.

THERE WAS SHARP criticism of the quality of the program from one quarter—this gathering at least thought the first program was not of top caliber.

"There was a much better show on the same topic on another channel," said one woman who must have been doing a bit of switching around. From the group and a report of indifference to the topic.

"THERE WERE only three in our discussion group out of 16 invited," said a spokesman, "and the hostess didn't even call those known to be against the program."

But in another area a church gathering attracted ten interested listeners—and each of the ten planned to gather a home group for the next program. All who have listened and discussed are invited to let the series leaders know their ideas before the next programs, set for June 10, 17 and 24.

Following are some of the comments made in this area after the first program:

"THE RASH of buying guns is going to cause a lot more harm than protection. There are going to be accidents involving children."

"Many of our neighbors seem to feel no responsibility for the inner city, have no guilt feelings. That's surprising to some of us."

"We have an inbred prejudice we are trying to overcome. We can't get a feeling of what it means to be poor, to be colored, to live in a ghetto."

"WE SHOULD let our congressmen know we're not satisfied with what is being done with our tax money. We should tell them we want more to go to help the poor."

"The employment problem is a large one. Some feel that the assembly line worker can upgrade himself and will get opportunity if he seeks it with diligence. Others believe fewer blacks have the educational background for the initial thrust. There is also the feeling that Negroes have been given more opportunity in the new program and that leaves fewer jobs open to white workers, which brings resentment."

"The black power movement is essentially the way of the young Negro asking for human dignity and respect, and is capable of contributing more to society."

"I STRUGGLE with the problem of becoming involved. Is it emotional, or could it be guilt complex?"

"We need to change attitudes, and this can happen only through the dialogical method, in small group discussions."

"My parents were much prejudiced, and I know I too have many prejudices, but I've been making a sincere effort over the last five years to overcome them."

"I don't intend to buy a gun. If there should be any trouble, I'll meet it instead with coffee and cake."
