Regarding the grounds that should be set for licensed abortion, George said that "under current conditions I would place priority on the statement of medical grounds;" without attempting to include humanitarian, eugenic, and socio-

ficanily.

Prof. B.J. George of the University of Michigan Law School made this prédiction at the University of Chicago's Conference of Abortion.

"The medical profession will continue to be highly conservative," George said, "but the elimination of criminal law disciplination of criminal law disciplination of criminal law disciplination of control and will at least force each doctor to decide whether and why he will meet his patient's requests for an abortion." The chief question, George moted, is not how many abortions may be performed, but rather "show many abortions actually performed will be done openly inhospitals and clinics."
