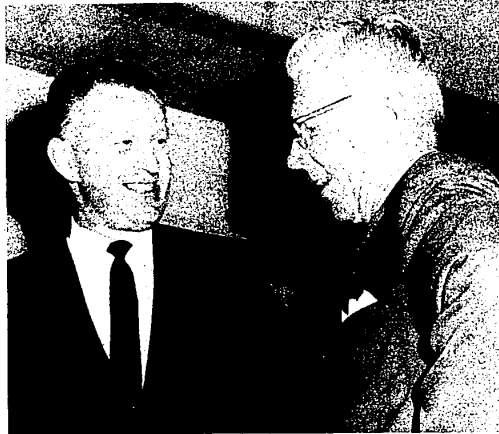


Seniors Win Scholarships

Two North Farmington High School seniors are among 49 Michigan high school students awarded college scholarships from the Chrysler Corporation Fund.

James R. Bonya of 28656 Kirkside will use his scholarship to pursue a career as a physicist at the University of Michigan. Janice K. Young of 30111 Old Bedford will also attend U-M and study to become a biologist.

Detroit-area winners will be honored June 12 in the Statler-Hilton Hotel. Virtually all Michigan winners rank in the top 10 per cent of their high school classes. Fifteen of the 49 state winners rank in the top one per cent.

Rain Forces Forest School Dedication Ceremony Inside

Formal dedication ceremonies for Farmington's newest school, Forest Elementary, 34545 Old Timber Rd., were moved inside Sunday because of the rain, but the affair was well attended.

Forest is known as the school with the outdoor classroom because its site is on a five-acre stand of virgin timber. Advance planning by the Board of Education and the architects, Halls-Hamill and Becker, has done much to preserve the beauty of the ancient oaks and beeches which surround the school building.

Forest Principal Waldon Fetz hopes to chart nature trails through the five acres of woodland to make it a meaningful study area. Bird life and wild life is abundant at the locale. Much classroom work is already being done to take advantage of the school's site.

Forest's 20 classrooms have been occupied since October 1967. Cost of the building was \$612,468; site cost was \$30,079.

Raider Cup Youth Hurt Critically

An 11-year-old Farmington boy remains in critical condition at Botsford General Hospital after being struck by a car Friday afternoon at Farmington Rd. and Grand River.

Gregory Hart, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank M. Hart of 23965 Drake, Farmington, was struck attempting to cross Farmington Rd., thrown 16 feet in the air, and landed on the side of his face.

He was rushed to Botsford in a police emergency van and treated for a broken pelvis and broken left leg between the thigh and knee.

Police and witnesses at the scene report the traffic light had already turned green when the Hart boy stepped in front of the vehicle driven by Miss Anne D. Hodge, age 19, of 28001 Farmington Rd., Farmington. No violations were issued by police.

A feature of the occasion, designed to honor all sports lettermen of the year, will be presentation of the Raider Cup to the person chosen as the outstanding senior athlete of 1967-68. The banquet will be held at 7 p.m. in the school cafeteria.

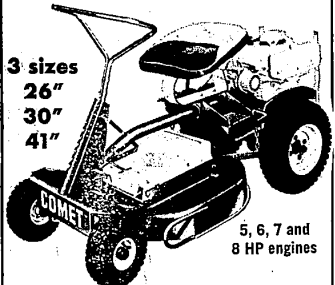
