Anticipate Huge July Festival

Farmington's Founders' Festival promises even more fun-packed events this year. The festival, to be held Thursday through Saturday, July 25 to July 27, will feature food, games, a queen, a parade, horse show, pet show, helicopter rides, band concert and people, people, people. Farmington residents who haven't seen each other for months are certain to meet at any one of a dozen places during the festival. It all adds to the gaiety. Grand opening ceremonies are planned for July 25 in the Downtown Shopping Center. A teen dance will be held that evening, place to be named later. The queen will also be crowned the evening of July 25. Preliminaries for the contest will be held July 23 in the Alexander Hamilton Insurance Co. finals July 25 at the Orchard Ridge campus. The Franklin band will play at the coronation ceremonies. Trinity White Shrine and the Order of the Eastern Star will stage their smorgasbord dinners festive nights in the Masonic Temple. The Elks will have their ox roast in the shopping center and the Jaycees their chicken barbecue on Thursday night. Business enterprises may obtain the official decoration for this year's festival from the Board of Commerce. The decoration is a stars and stripes bunting arrangement measuring 13 feet. The festival organizations committee, headed by Dr. John Richardson, had application forms for organizational participation in the festival. Applications must be accompanied by a \$10 fee to defray the costs of administration, publicity and promotion. Participating groups will this year be asked to donate 10 percent of their net profits to the Festival Fund to support this year's event and to continue expanding and upgrading the festival. Location assignments will be made by the Board of Commerce and will be made on the basis of the date of receipt of the application. Organizations that had concessions last year must apply prior to June 15 to insure the same location as last year. Deadline for application for all others is July 1. Elementary classes offered include: math improvement; science explorations; improvement in reading skills; mechanics of composition and study skills; creative writing; oral interpretation of poetry; baseball and instrumental music. Secondary students may enroll in classes for math, social studies, science, English, history, algebra, geometry, typing and reading improvement.
