



Pioneer Policewoman Dies At 82

Funeral services for one of Detroit's first policewomen, the mother of *Observer* Newspapers feature writer Elizabeth Wissman, will be held Monday.

Mrs. Harvey (Arthalean) Patton, 82, died suddenly Thursday while shopping in a downtown Detroit store.

She was appointed one of Detroit's first policewomen in 1921, made the first policewoman arrest in a liquor case, and retired in 1952. Her late husband was a Detroit News police beat reporter.

She is survived by her son, Harvey, an associate editor of the *News*; and her daughter, Mrs. Melvin (Elizabeth) Wissman of Farmington, on the staff of the *Farmington Enterprise* & *Observer*.

Services will be held in the Ted C. Sullivan Funeral Home, W. McNichols near Freeland, Detroit.

Cost Won't Determine How Nylons Wear

Consumers Union set up a test panel to try out the new inexpensive line of nylons by a nationally advertised manufacturer.

The contestants were a higher priced nylon at \$1.50 a pair, a 50-cent pair, and a mail-order brand at three pairs for \$1.32 plus postage.

All three models fared about the same. Some individual stockings ran as soon as they were put on; others were still going strong after more than 300 hours of wear.

Average test life was 115 hours, or roughly 10 days.

Conclusion: Special color, size, or quality of fit may lead you to choose higher priced nylons, but you're not buying longer wear, if you find a color and size that satisfies in the cheaper model, you can save a considerable number of dollars in a year of runs.

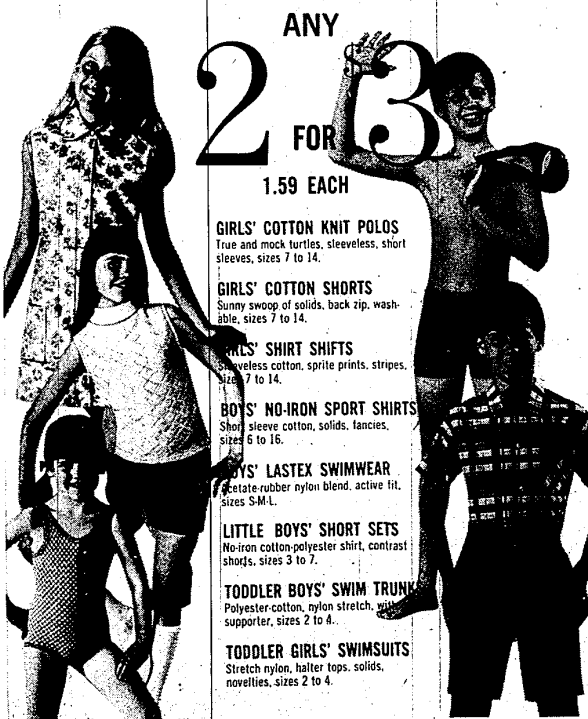
