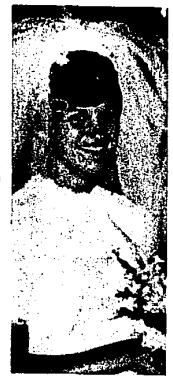
HER SILK ILLUSION veil was secured by a cluster of lace petals.

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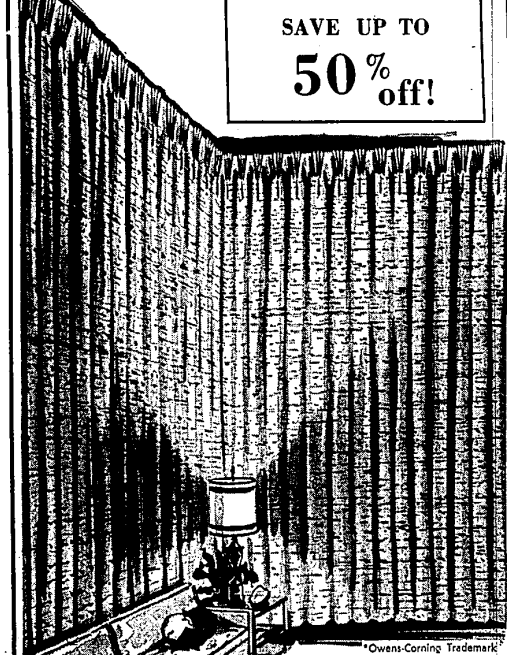
