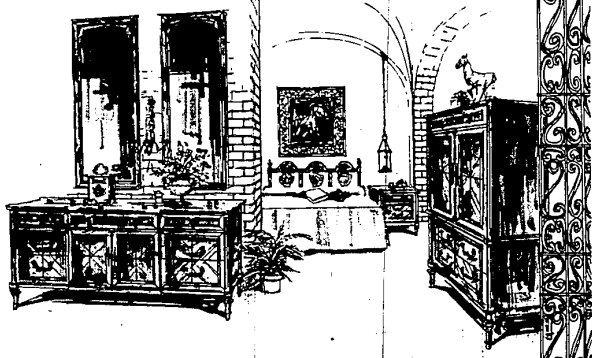

Riots' Reasons Known

BOSTON -- We already know why racial conflict began in the United States, and the problem now is to decide where we go from here, a University of Michigan consultant to the President's Commission on Civil Disorders, reports.

Dr. Nathan S. Caplan suggested at Boston University's Conference on Race Relations that "research on the etiology and persistence of ghetto rioting is now less important than research on the problem of resolution, more specifically, exploring ways for people to work together to survive in conflict."

IT IS IMPORTANT, he added, to avoid "a Hobbesian state of affairs in which everyone uses all available means against everyone else for his own ends."

Dr. Caplan, a program associate in the University of Michigan's Institute for Social Research, is author of a portion of the recent report by the Kerner Commission.

By far the most hideous crimes throughout history have been committed in the name of obedience rather than rebellion, he declared, adding:

"If WE MISINTERPRET what motivates Negroes to riot, then we are very likely to find ourselves committing crimes in the name of obedience to our own country."

"That is why it is so terribly important that we be accurate in defining the ghetto problem--because how we define it determines what we will do about it," he said.

Such action-decisions, Caplan suggested, also determine the moral course of the society, "since all social action is predicated upon an assumption of human worth and social status, what will be done to help a person is greatly influenced by someone's estimation of what that person is worth."
