VIRGINIA LAW prohibits any

VIRGINA LAW prohibits any agency of the state or local po-litical subdivisions from sego-tiating or bargaining with em-ploye unions. Under the 1946 law, any employe—state, city or county—who goes on strike or otherwise falls to report for work shall be fired.

Town has a so-called right-to—work law, but it has no legislation prohibiting strikes either by public employes or in-dustrial employes, it does have a law prohibiting collective bar-gaining between state agencies and its employes.
