## Festival Views Olde England

LONDON, Ont. — London, England, may never be in your travel plans, but you can capture many of its sights and sounds on a motor trip this summer.

The Canadian namesake, a picturesque Ontario city 120 miles east of the Detroit-Windsor border, is staging its third Olde English style Fortnight festival, June 29 to July 13, replete with bobbies and beef-eaters, double-decker bus rides, and a genuine London pub.

PREVIOUSLY, the city and its chamber of commerce did it alone with help from the Ontario Department of Tourism and Information. But this year, with added support from the Canadian government, the British National Export Council, and the British Canadian Trade Association, the festival will be presented as a large-scale attraction with events taking place every day.

These include soccer games and cricket matches, rowing regattas on the Thames, daily street parades, and Scottish country dancing, poetry in the park and a tea party billed as the biggest since the famous one in Boston.

There'll be competitions in tennis, lawn bowling, and fencing, one-act plays and noon-hour variety shows, a replica display of the royal crown jewels and a model Eros fountain.

The British groups are showcasing British-made goods in all major downtown stores and suburban shopping malls and supplying the banners and bunting to decorate all the city's business streets. The British are also erecting a 26-foot-tall Westminster tower with a working model of Big Ben and will show a display of British motor cars.

A LOCAL BREWERY is financing an appearance of the world renowned, 90-piece Irish Guards band which will put on free concerts in the first four days. And military ceremonies will be staged nightly by the Canadian armed forces.

While most events reflect British tradition, there are spectacular home-spun ones besides, including a cycle marathon, a water show featuring skiing and hovercraft, and a parachute drop in the park.

A movie theater will introduce visitors to England with continuous performances. And the typical London pub, called the Red Lion, is to be set up in the local armories complete with darts and skittles.

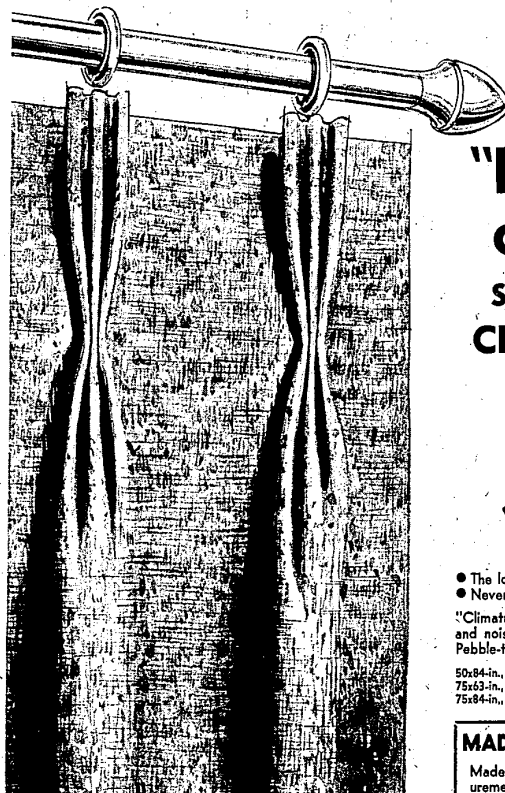
