

# McCarthy Wins NY Primary, Jolts HHH

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Senator Eugene J. McCarthy jolted New York Democratic forces by overpowering Humphrey and Kennedy delegate slates while a McCarthy supporter scored an upset victory in a three-way Senate race.

Partial returns slowed by hand-counting of paper ballots gave McCarthy 51 of the 123

convention delegate slots at stake. Kennedy delegates won 20 while Humphrey backers had one.

The voting trend indicated McCarthy would maintain the wide lead in delegates. McCarthy hailed the results as one of his greatest victories.

The surprise Senate primary victor was Paul O'Dwyer, a for-

mer city councilman and brother of the former mayor of New York City. He defeated Eugene H. Nickerson, county executive of Nassau County.

WASHINGTON -- The U.S. General Accounting Office has rejected a challenge to the legality of two new Army contracts for production of M16 rifles.

In a report to a special House subcommittee, the GAO said the Army could legally ignore price in determining which of four firms should receive the contracts.

Contracts for 240,000 rifles were awarded to Hydra-Matic Division of General Motors, Ypsilanti, and Harrington and Richardson Co., Worcester, Mass. The GM contract had a ceiling price of \$56 million and the Richardson had a \$42 million ceiling.

The Army's action was challenged after disclosure that Cadillac Gage of Warren was paid the right to submit price data until requested.

The Army said its selection was based on those firms "which will afford to the government the highest degree of confidence in their ability in meeting and exceeding the accelerated schedule." The Army told the firms not to submit price data until requested.

WASHINGTON -- The Supreme Court dramatically underscored Negro rights in housing and education while handing two important victories to the policeman on the beat.

Negroes won a resounding victory when the Court ruled that a law dating back to 1886 bans racial discrimination in the sale and rental of housing. Earlier in the term, the Court prodded lagging school desegregation by ruling out "freedom of choice" plans now in use throughout most of the South. If more effective means are available to eliminate separate schools.

In the area of law enforcement, the justices approved police eavesdropping, provided it is carried out under proper court orders; ruled policemen can stop suspicious characters in public places and frisk them for dangerous weapons, if reasonably necessary under the circumstances.

OTTAWA -- The Canadian-U.S. agreement to combine forces for the air defense of North America was born in political strife 10 years ago and the issue has cropped up again in Canada's national election campaigns.

T.C. Douglas, leader of the New Democratic party, claims the North American Air Defense Command (NORAD) is an obsolete concept and that Canada could find better uses for the \$140 million it spent this way last year.

Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau says Canada should emphasize a continental defense role rather than participation in NATO. His statement seemed to discount any

Canadian initiative on NORAD if he remains in power.

PORTLAND, Maine -- Actor Gary Merrill, a proven success at drawing people to the box office, was not very successful in drawing Maine voters to the polls to vote for him.

The 52-year-old Vietnam critic finished last on the Republican ballot in primary voting for the state's 1st District congressional nomination.

WEST PALM BEACH -- A 21-year-old coed from San Jose State College in California has been picked National College Queen. She is the first Negro to win the 14-year-old pageant.

Valerie Dickerson, 5-feet-

3 and 111 pounds, won the title and \$10,000 in prizes in competition with 49 other girls representing U.S. colleges.

Representing Michigan in the pageant was Virginia A. Kurnz, 21, of White Lake Township, Oakland County. Miss Kurnz is a junior at Eastern Michigan University.

NEW ORLEANS -- Clay L. Shaw has asked a federal court to bar District Attorney Jim Garrison from prosecuting him on a charge of conspiring to murder President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw also asked the three-judge court to rule that the

Warren Report be made "valid and binding" on every court in the nation.

Shaw's lawyers argue that Garrison's sole motive in prosecuting the 55-year-old retired businessman is to provide himself with a forum for attacking the Warren Commission.

LONDON -- A June 27 hearing has been scheduled on the U.S. government's application to return James Earl Ray to Tennessee for trial on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Ray's attorney, Roger Frisby, indicated that the 40-year-old escaped convict would fight

extradition. British extradition hearings usually last a day or two, and the magistrate generally gives his decision as soon as he hears all the evidence.

SAN FRANCISCO -- The Board of Supervisors has passed a gun law requiring registration of all firearms sold or transferred within San Francisco.

Registration will involve a \$2 fee with a receipt like an automobile registration slip. Violators would be subject to a \$500 fine or six months in jail, plus confiscation of weapons.

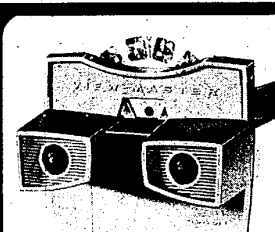

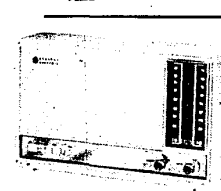

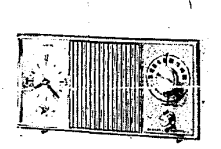
