Oldest War Vet Dies

Clarence D. Reniff, of 21255 Hancock, Farmington's last survivor of the Spanish-American War, died last Monday in Botsford General Hospital. He had lived in Farmington for 48 years.

Reniff served with the 15th United States Cavalry from 1907 to 1910 as a private. The Spanish-American War, correctly termed the Cuban Occupation Conflict, was the last war in which the American forces used horses in any type of combat.

A year ago, when he talked to The Enterprise & Observer about his war experience, Reniff recalled he had never been on a horse and he was drafted at the age of 18. He remembered that horses were so important at that time to the Army that they were fed before the men were fed.

During his Army service in Cuba, Reniff contracted Yellow Fever and recalled that the disease disabled more men of the cavalry than the war.

In recent years, the veteran always rode in Detroit's Memorial Day parade, but had to stop when he caught pneumonia three years ago, from which he never fully recovered. Services were held June 19 in Henry-Sundquist Funeral Home. A chapel service was held June 17 by Farmington View Rd. 4035. Burial was in Oakland Hills Memorial Gardens.
