# News Considers Publishing

Hope for a settlement of the 219-day strike of Metropolitan Detroit daily newspapers appeared dimmer than ever Friday after a meeting of the unions with publishers of the Detroit Free Press and Detroit News.

The unions had asked for the gathering, and there was some indication the session might bring a settlement.

Neither side had much to say after the meeting with the exception that it had netted absolutely nothing.

Later, officials of the Detroit News let it be known that they were considering the possibility of setting up crews made of supervisory personnel with the thought of trying to publish a paper.

There was no official confirmation, and the News publishers refused to say anything more than "we are studying such a possibility."

In the meantime, the last minute proposal of Mediator Dr. Nathan Fehnsterer for an economic package of \$300,000 and a 36-month contract with an additional \$1 per month for the final three months is still

before the unions. The publishers agreed to the proposal, but it was flatly rejected by the unions shortly after Dr. Fehnsterer made it Sunday at midnight.

J. Kelley has ruled that Michigan State University Vice President Phillip J. May's private dealings have resulted in a conflict of interest.

While these private business

interests should not be allowed to continue, Kelley said, it would be unfair to punish May for past conduct.

Target of the criticism of May is a \$1.2 million East Lansing office building in which May's wife, Viola, holds a substantial interest and is leased in large part by the IBM Corp., a major supplier to MSU.

Kelley's office said opinions requested on possible conflicts involving MSU trustee C. Allen Harlan and MSU President John A. Hannah would be ready soon.

LANSING -- The State Administration Board has authorized the state to borrow \$70 million to help meet the first school aid payments for fiscal 1968-69.

Some \$30 million of the total will go for school aid advances in "hardship cases," while the other \$50 million will be needed for the regular school aid payments.

This second early expenditure was necessitated by the state Legislature when it moved the date for issuance of those payments from Aug. 25 to Aug. 1.

## Local Reserve Company Drills On Prisoners, Riots

More than a 1,000 Army Reservists, including members of 390th MP Command and the 603 MP Company C, of Livonia, have returned home after two weeks of field exercises at Fort Gordon, Georgia.

Military police units from eight states completed "Brown Thrasher III," practicing prisoners of war operations.

Reservists also observed riot control demonstrations, a full-fledged course which has been attended by police officers from major cities throughout the United States.

EACH UNIT was given extensive training in handling prisoners, enforcing the rules of the Geneva convention and meeting standards set for visits of prisoners by the International Red Cross.

Brig. Gen. Arthur F. Brandstetter, who lives in East Lansing, commands the 300th, which supervises units from throughout the midwest and numerous southern states.




