

Set Vocational Ed As Separate Unit

Vocational Education will be accorded the status of a separate division of Oakland Schools as of July 1, according to an announcement by Dr. William J. Emerson, superintendent of the intermediate district.

Dr. David W. Soule, director of vocational education, will head the new division.

The Board of Education of Oakland Schools has now signed contracts with Royal Oak, Pontiac, Clarkston and Walled Lake to operate vocational centers. Pontiac has purchased a site near the Northern High School campus; Royal Oak and Clark-

ston have options on sites. Each of these three districts has hired a principal to begin development of operation plans.

A curriculum staff of four specialists who will work with Dr. Soule has been hired. Dr. James Hannebaum, now research consultant for the State Department of Education's division of vocational education will be in charge of the trade and industrial curriculum. John Norman Cain, vocational education director of Fraser Public Schools, will be business education consultant. Dr. Ruth Midjars, head of home economics in the Colorado State University of College of Education, will direct the home economics program. Donald Leatherman, head of the University of Michigan education library, will be in charge of the area center libraries.

June 24 Opening Date For FARC Summer

The Farmington Area Recreation Commission's summer program, to be held from June 24 through Aug. 2, is set for eight elementary schools.

Children from eight to 15 years of age may pick up registration forms at the school nearest their home.

Programs will be held at Beechview, Eagle, Kenbrook and Westville schools in the North Section; Cloverdale, GHI, Shawassee and William Grace schools in the South Section. There are no set boundaries for those who take part; children attend the school nearest their home.

The program is free of charge for all those eligible. Bus departure, safety regulations, rules and other regulations are listed on the registration forms. Youngsters should plan to bring a lunch on all field trips and swim dates.

North Section children will swim on Monday and Wednesday and have athletic and crafts on Tuesday and Thursday at the playground. The South Section will alternate with this schedule.

North Section will visit the Detroit Zoo on June 28 and see the Tigers play on July 29. South Section will see the Tigers in action on July 6 and attend the Zoo on July 12.

A combined field day is planned for July 28. Children will compete for prizes donated by local merchants. On Aug. 2, a combined trip to Bob-Lo Island will end the program.

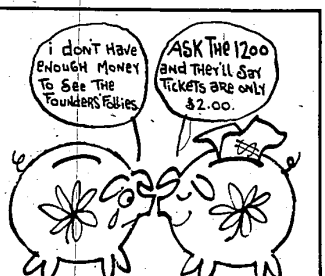
