

Court Districts Hiking Pay

The state will guarantee the new district judges at least \$18,000 a year when they take office next Jan. 1.

But most districts in Oberlin and surrounding areas are planning to supplement the salaries. Under state law, they may add another

\$9,500 for a total of \$27,500. Candidates for district judgeships have until next Tuesday, July 2, at 4 p.m. to file for a place on the Aug. 6 primary ballot.

FARMINGTON city and township, for example, have agreed to chip in the full \$9,500. The township board voted last Monday, and the city commission gave its approval the week prior.

Farmington city and township constitute District 47 with one judge.

LIVONIA COUNCILMEN have tacitly agreed to supplement the state \$18,000 salary, but so far they haven't set a figure.

Livonia, which is all of District 16, will have two judges. Plymouth city and township, Northville city and township and Canton Township officials will

meet July 10 to discuss the salary of the single judge who will serve their District 35.

Westland hasn't discussed the salary for its two judges in District 35. The city council had opposed going into the district court setup, preferring to retain its municipal court, but Mayor Thomas Brown vetoed the council action.

REDFORD TOWNSHIP board members recently passed a budget that made no provision for supplementing two judges' salaries in District 17.

But Redford voters will see a one-mill tax increase proposal on the Aug. 6 ballot. Presumably if it passes, the township board might consider a supplement.

Garden City councilmen voted \$7,500 supplement to pay its single judge \$25,500.

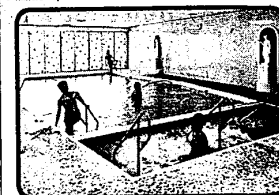

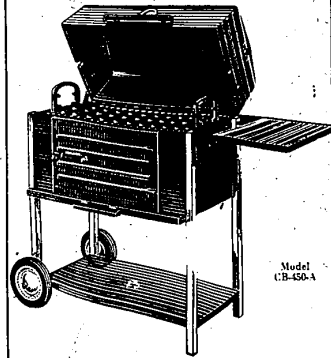

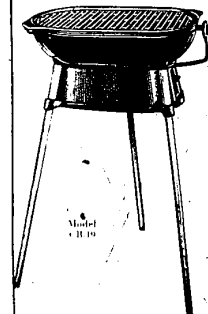
