PARENT-TEACHER COOPERATION TOPIC AT CLARENCEVILLE

"How Parents and Teachers May Cooperate to Improve the School Program" was the topic under panel discussion last Tuesday at the Clarenceville Parent-Teachers Association meeting, held in the study hall of the school.

The panel consisted of Max Miller, high school principal; Mrs. White, grade school principal; Mrs. Babbitt, a grade teacher; Mrs. Meyer and Mr. Richard Gault, parents of high school students; Mrs. Vanderhoff and Mrs. Daniels, grade parents; and Mr. Daniels, a resident having no children in school. Louis Schmidt, superintendent of schools, acted as moderator.

On opening the program, Mr. Schmidt asked the principals to explain the school program. Mrs. White stated that it is a program designed to develop every potential in every child to the fullest of his possibilities. Mr. Miller's idea of the school program is the experience of what is most essential for children's development.

After discussion, the panel generally accepted that much could be done toward parents-teacher cooperation by the development of positive rather than negative attitudes. The grade teachers have established a program whereby they make definite appointments with the parents to visit the school and discuss child problems.

Following the discussion, a concert was given by the Junior Chorus, directed by Leo Larue. The chorus is composed of pupils in the fourth and fifth grades.
