### CONSUMERS REPORTS INCREASE IN LOCAL GAS USERS

A growth of 33 per cent in the number of natural gas customers of Consumers Power Company in western Wayne County was reported this week by George L. Mayhew, district manager of the company's new West Wayne District. This district includes Plymouth, Wayne, Northville, Farmington, Northville, Novi, Farmington, Nankin and Livonia.

"At the end of the war there were 7,900 natural gas customers in this area," said Mr. Mayhew. "By the end of 1950 the number will be about 10,500, a gain of 33 per cent."

It was this rapid growth that led to the establishment of the West Wayne District. With a district office and staff in Plymouth we will be in a better position to meet the needs of our customers in western Wayne County continues to grow."

### MASS BLOOD TYPING WOULD SAVE LIVES, U-M DOCTOR SAYS

Mass blood-typing of the general population might save countless lives in the event of an atomic disaster, according to a University of Michigan doctor.

Speed in obtaining the right type of blood donors, the major problem in such a crisis, would result if every person knew their own blood type, Dr. Otto Tod Mallory, Jr., chief of the clinical laboratories at the University Hospital, declared.

Carrying out the simple procedure of a disaster would enable blood-taking units to rapidly collect a known type of blood for immediate treatment of the most urgent casualties, he said.

Dr. Mallory pointed out that since it is possible to give all casualties the same type of blood regardless of their individual type, the major problem during an emergency is to obtain donors with this "universal" type without having to test people who might have some other types of blood.

He explained that there are basically four blood types, O, A, B, and AB, each containing either a positive or negative "Rh" factor.

### OAK WILT WARNING GIVEN BY FORESTER AT ANN ARBOR

Persons who own or use woodlots or shade trees are warned by a University of Michigan forester to be alert for signs of oak wilt.

Although there are no cases in Michigan of the disease that attacks oak trees, it is prevalent in the Chicago area, according to Dow V. Baxter, professor of forest pathology in the University's School of Natural Resources.

"If the oak wilt disease comes into the state it will probably first appear in the extreme southwestern part," he says.

All oak trees are susceptible to the fungi but it is most severe in red oak.

Oak wilt is most conspicuous from June through autumn. The symptoms at first are a slight wilting of the leaves or yellowing before falling. Mature leaves remain relatively stiff while the young ones blacken as they wilt and stay on the twigs.

Internal symptoms of oak wilt are brown bark breaks in the outer sapwood, just beneath the bark. Another symptom, Professor Baxter points out, is the speed with which oak wilt develops much faster than other oak diseases.

The disease is spread from one tree to another in a very curious way. Infected trees spread oak leaves through their roots to other trees. Tree roots have to come in contact with each other to transmit the fungi.

Officials of the Ontario department of lands and forests have been studying improvements made on some of Michigan's noted trout waters.
