Entertainment will be furnished by the dancing pupils of Mrs. Betty Johnson of Farmington.

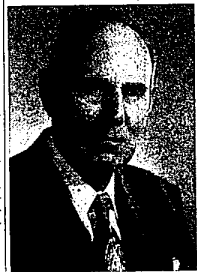
FARMINGTON LIONS CLUB CELEBRATES FOUNDERS' DAY

Supervisor Candidates Express Views On Township Affairs

Ernest V. Blanchard, incumbent township supervisor, will again seek nomination on the Republican ticket for candidacy in the Township Supervisor race this spring.

Blanchard, who has been a resident of the township since he was three years old, received his education from Farmington schools.

In a summary of his activities as Township Supervisor, Blanchard points out that there have been no township taxes for five years; the township has operated solely on Sales Tax, Diversion, Intangible Tax, and Liquor License fees.

Blanchard further states that he appeared before the county road commission and worked out a plan for road improvement which cost the township only \$20,000.

Blanchard also says, "A township supervisor has many problems such as hospitalization, welfare, old age assistance, aid for the blind, veterans, widows, and others too numerous to mention."

Richard E. (Dick) Priebe, 49, will face Farmington Township voters February 19 as a candidate for nomination to the Republican party candidacy for Township Supervisor.
