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Flash pasteurization spurs Michigan apple juice industry

In 1950, half a million bushels of Michigan apples, which otherwise would have been a loss to their owners, were converted to top-quality apple juice, thanks to efforts of the Michigan State College Agricultural Experiment Station. Flash pasteurization at packing time was found to preserve both color and flavor of the juice, making it available for year-round use. The research workers have also found a way to fortify apple juice with Vitamin C. Improvements in packing have helped reduce costs and speed up operations. As a result, a million bushels of Michigan apples should be profitably converted into juice in 1951. The information will come from the radio and press section of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Washington. I hope this news will be of value to the veteran as well as other citizens.

I will start the column by giving some of you good news. The National Service Life Insurance has announced the second dividend, totaling \$65 million, with an average payment estimate at \$55. V. A. says that the first checks will be ready April 1. The V. A. urges you not to write in about your check, it will only cause delay. Of course, only penalties to those who have kept the insurance in force.

Word comes from the White House that the President's Committee of Religion and Welfare in the Armed Forces will be discontinued as of February 19... reason, no money. Congress refused to appropriate funds for its continuance. Its purpose was "to promote the spiritual, moral and recreational welfare and character guidance for the armed forces." The President complimented the committee and expressed his regret that it could not be continued.

Representative Edith Rogers of Massachusetts recently introduced a bill into the House asking for the Veterans Administration to become a full fledged governmental department, with a secretary of cab-

inet rank, also an under-secretary and five assistants. If passed, one of the assistants would be known as the Surgeon General of the Veterans Administration.

Still kicking around the capital and the pentagon is the question of the Military Reserve program. Admittedly fouled up, the program is undergoing hearings by the C. C. Board. The chief gripe of the Reservists is that he is called up regardless of family ties, age or past service, whereas the draftee, on the other hand, knows that short of an all out war they will be released to (inactive) duty after 21 months.

On February 21 the Ladies Auxiliary sponsored an adult education class at the Town Hall, to which all nearby people were invited as well as the public. The speaker, Commander Slater, spoke on American and Civil Defense.

Our Military Ball date has been changed from February to March 31 because the Garry - Lint post is having a dance on February 24. Through the goodness of one of our local comrades, the post will have another meeting place after March 1. — rent free! And we have plans that we might have a more enjoyable meeting. It is a smaller place, but we are small. Let's pay up the back dues we owe and get big.

MUNICIPAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL TO OPEN IN APRIL

The opening session of the newly established municipal police training school was tentatively set for the first week in April by the police training committee of the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police at a meeting at State Police headquarters in East Lansing.

The four-week course will be held on the Michigan State College campus and about 30 trainees will be enrolled. The tuition fee is \$25.00 and the course is open to all municipal departments. It is the first school of its kind to be held in the state.

Chief Richard W. Rogers of Midland, president of the association, announced that Charles F. Rhodes, who has been employed by the college as coordinator of the program, Rhodes, a former Detroit police officer who retired after 27 years of service, was head of the department's police academy for 15 years. For 12 years thereafter he was chief of police in Pontiac.

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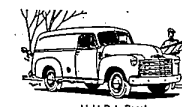
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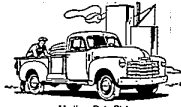
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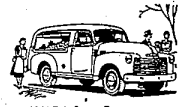

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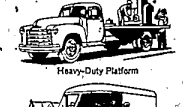
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Heavy-Duty 12-Foot Stake



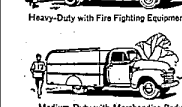
Heavy-Duty High Rack with Hoist



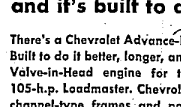
Van Body with Lift Gate on Heavy-Duty Chassis



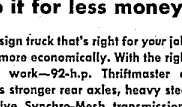
Heavy-Duty with Crane and Winch

Heavy-Duty with Dump Body



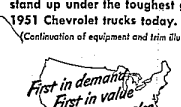

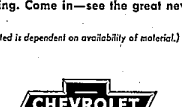
