**Conservation Arrests Drop During January**

Arrests for conservation law violations declined considerably in January, the conservation department disclosed.

The department's law enforcement division recorded 133 arrests as compared to 252 in December. January 1950 arrests totaled 153. Fishing without a license, fish tags with more than two lines, and failure to affix name and address to the fishing shanty tripped up the largest number of violators.

Court penalties assessed included fines and costs of \$2,430 and 102 days in jail.

**Supply Bait Dealers With Starter Stock**

There is no change from last spring's price schedule of \$2.50 a thousand for advanced chub fry and \$1.50 a thousand for advanced sucker fry. Stock must be ordered on special forms which can be secured by writing the district fisheries supervisor, department of conservation, Plainwell.






