### EXPERIMENT LAKES REVERT TO REGULAR FISHING STATUS

Eleven experimentally designated lower peninsula lakes have reverted to regular lake status, the conservation department reminds anglers.

These lakes are, in Harry County: Craig, Branch County; Dack, Calhoun County; Lobdell, Genesee County; Pike, Grand Traverse County; Bear, Hillsdale County; Isle Portage, Jackson County; Pontiac, Oakland County; Minnewaukon, St. Joseph County; Sadleir, Van Buren County; and Sugarloaf, Washtenaw County. Statutory maximum five year period of special fishing regulations on Whitmore lake, Washtenaw and Livingston Counties, ends April 1.

With the exception of Pike lake, this means no further fishing, even on a regular lake, after March, until June 25 when the general season opens and regular size and creel limits apply as listed in the fish law digest. Pike lake, in the category of "all-out" lakes north of highway M-46, still is open for some fishing after March. On lakes north of M-46 there is no closed season on crappies, rock bass, yellow perch, warmouth bass and certain other species listed in the digest.

### Shortage Of Home Ec Teachers Is Acute

The shortage of teachers in all fields, has usually been critical, but in home economics teaching the demand for teachers exceeds the supply by about 50 per cent as of this month.

"The number of job openings for homemaking teachers in Michigan alone is expected to increase greatly before school starts in fall," according to Rosalind B. Montzer, assistant professor of home economics education at Michigan State College.

College graduates in homemaking are going into positions in Michigan high schools at salaries of from \$2,700 to \$3,200 for about nine months' work, depending upon the type of school.

For the person who likes to work with young people, particularly girls, homemaking teaching is a field with unlimited possibilities. Six Michigan colleges offer degrees in homemaking (teaching which will enable the graduate to teach in any high school in the state. Other colleges train teachers for work in non-vocational schools only.

The six colleges are Michigan State College; Wayne University, Detroit; Central Michigan College of Education, Mt. Pleasant; Northern Michigan College of Education, Marquette; Western Michigan College of Education, Kalamazoo; and Michigan State Normal College, Ypsilanti.

### Henry Russell Lecture At U-M Set For May 1

The 25th annual Henry Russell Lecture will be given at the University of Michigan on Tuesday, May 1, 1951.

A. Franklin Shull, professor of zoology, will give the lecture. The title will be "Some Problems of Origin in Biology." The honor of giving the lecture goes each year to the faculty member adjudged to have achieved the highest distinction in his chosen field of scholarship.

At the time of the lecture, the winner of the Henry Russell Award will be announced. The award is conferred each year upon the member of the faculty of the rank of instructor or assistant professor whose work as teacher and researcher is outstanding and holds great promise for the future.

The lectureship and award were endowed by Henry Russell of Detroit who received the bachelor's degree in 1837, the master's degree in 1874, and bachelor of laws degree in 1875 from the university.

### Waste Big Item In Household Costs

Household waste can add up to dollars and cents in these days of high prices. Dr. Calla Van Syckle of the Michigan State College school of home economics advises this week.

She says the whole family can be enlisted in the job of checking wasteful practices in the home. Some of the points she recommends are:

1. Check on the amount of food prepared against plate waste or waste from left-overs that are thrown out.
2. Look over the food you store. Are you losing food through over-canning, or too long storage?
3. What about your household equipment? Is it kept in good running condition through proper cleaning, oiling and other recommended measures?
4. Give good care to your pots, pans and pressure cooker.
5. Check on whether furniture is wearing out because of bad treatment or lack of mending. Together with other family members, make a plan for renovating, rehabilitating and repairing. Interest the family in reasonably good treatment of furniture without restricting their use of it.
6. Look over clothing with an eye to what can be salvaged for another year's use by a reasonable amount of repairing or making over.

Check family practices in use of electricity. Are lights turned out when not in use? Is the radio turned off when not in use?

When you follow these and other money-saving practices, you'll be adding your family finances and the nation. Remember, says Dr. Van Syckle, that a force of 40 million homemakers will help turn the scales either for or against inflation.

If you see a few hawks and owls around the place, don't get too concerned because in reasonable numbers these birds give you good assistance in cost control.
