Waste Big Item In Household Costs

Household waste can add up to dollars and cents in these days of high prices, Dr. Calla Van Syckle of the Michigan State College school of home economics advised

this week.

She says the whole family can
be enlisted in the job of checking
wasteful practices in the home.
Some of the points she recommends

are:

1. Check on the amount of food prepared against plate waste or waste from left-overs that are thrown out.

2. Look over the food you store.

Look over the food you store. Are you losing food through care-less storage or too long storage?
 What about your bousehold equipment? Is it kept in good running condition through proper cleaning, oiling and other recom-

clambing of the composition of t cleaning, oiling and other recommended measures?

4. Give good care to your point
pans and pressure cooker.

5. Check on whether furniture is
wearing out because of bad treatment or lack of mending. Together with other family members,
make a plan for renovating, rehabilitating and repairing. Interest
the family in reasonably good treatment of furniture without restrictment of furniture without restrict-

amount of repairing or making over.
Check family practices in use of electricity. Are lights turned out when not in use? Is the radium of turned off when not in use? When you follow these and other money-saving practices, you'll be aiding your family finances and the nation. Remember, says Dr. Van Syckie, that a force of 40 million homemakers will help turn the scales either for or against infiation for their granddaughter, Mary Soles.
