Zoning Code Publication Awaits Map Completion

Publication of the zoning code drawn up by the Township Zoning Board awaits only the completion of the zoning map, it was announced Tuesday. The penciled map must be re-drawn in ink before it went to the engravers, who will make a printing plate from it.

As soon as the map is completed, presumably by Zoning Board member George V. McLaughlin, the code will be published for distribution to township residents. Following publication and study, residents will have an opportunity to voice their opinions of the project at public meetings, prior to the submission of the ordinance to the Township Board.

NEWLY ORGANIZED POLIO CHAPTER TO MEET TUESDAY

Next Tuesday representatives from Farmington and other communities in Southwest Oakland County will meet at the Town Hall for the first meeting of the newly organized National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis Chapter.

Walter Delmonter, Chapter director, stated that representatives from New Hudson, South Lyon, Novi, Walled Lake, Wixom and Farmington will attend the meeting. A film will be shown following through the treatment of a polio case from the time of contracting the disease to the final cure. Mrs. R. C. Gensert, state advisor of Women's Activities, will be the main speaker. Mrs. Ruth W. Parsiwill also speak on the activities of the Oakland County Chapter. Mr. Scott Shegoff from the State Office will show the film. A tea will follow the meeting.

On Thursday, April 5, this same group will visit Herman Kiefer Hospital and go through the polio ward. The trip is under the auspices of the National Foundation and the Oakland County Chapter.

Dedicate New Church Sunday Afternoon

The Forest Hills United Missionary Church, constructed by its own congregation, will be dedicated this Sunday with a special service at 3:00 p.m. Speaker at the dedication service will be Jasper A. Huffman, D.D., president of the Winona Lake School of Theology at Winona Lake, Indiana.

The religious educator, who has served with several colleges, has written a number of books. One, "The Stones Cry Out" was chosen as a Book-of-the-Month Club selection. Dr. Huffman has recently returned from an archaeological expedition in Palestine.

The Forest Hills Church at 12 Mile and Stansbury, two blocks east of Orchard Lake Road, was built by former members of the Dakota Avenue United Missionary Church. Ground was broken for the building in April of 1950, and most of the work in constructing the church was performed by members of the congregation. Joe Jones is pastor.
