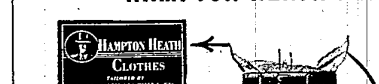

Mr. Chester Menendez of Power Road is spending a couple weeks in Mexico on a business trip.

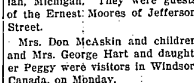

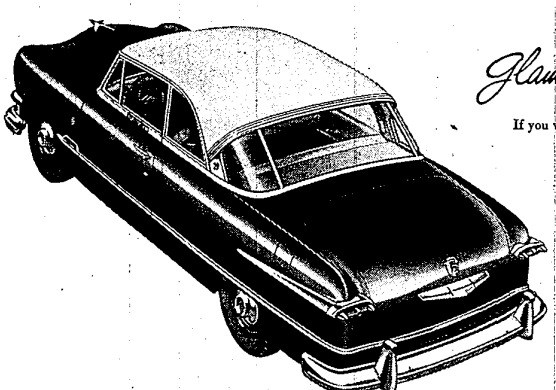

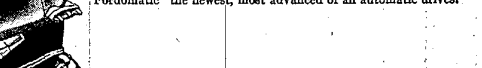
